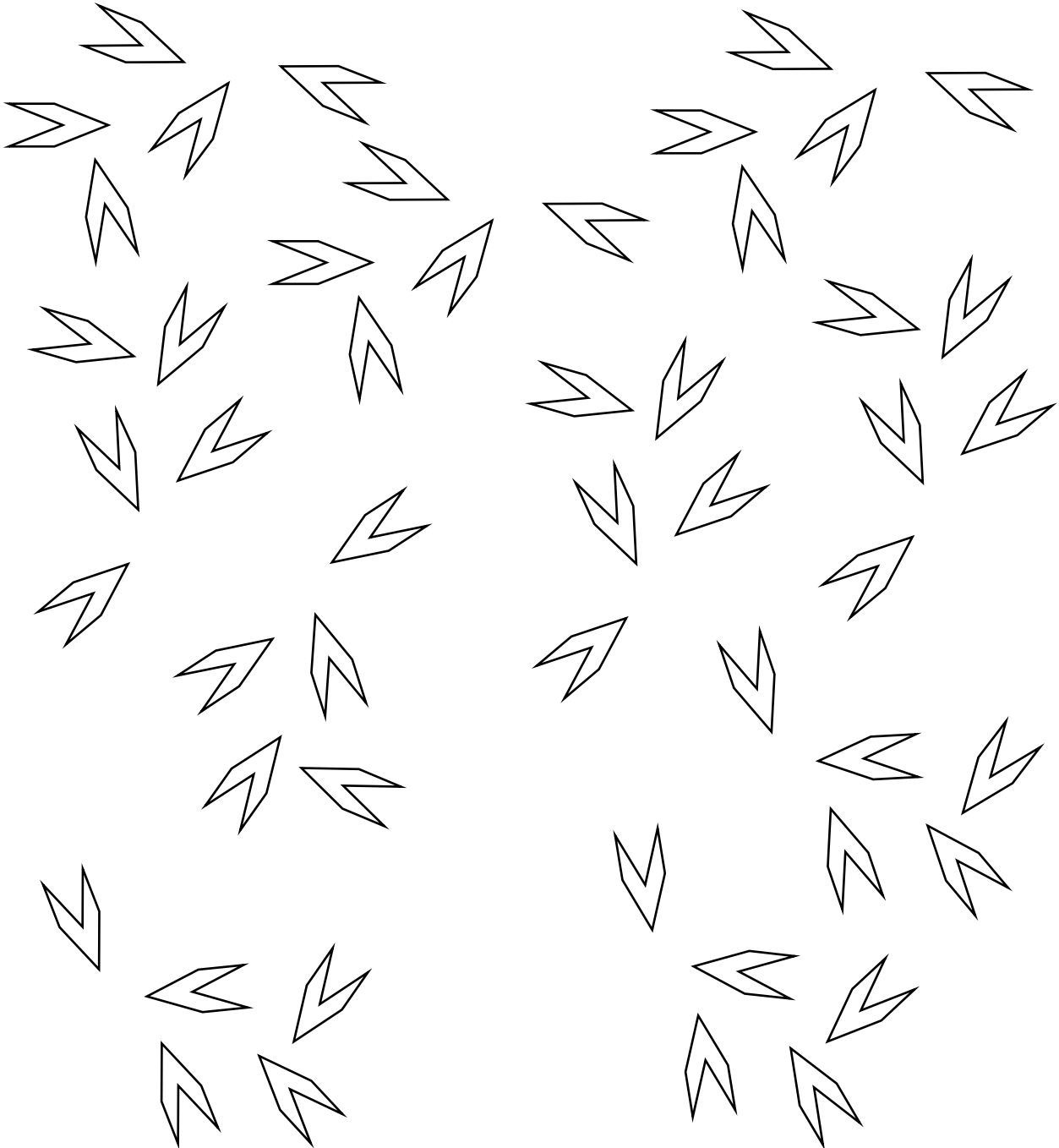

The important part of this exercise is to group what has been counted so that if you lose count half way it is easy to back track because the groups of five have been marked off.
